English

PSHE

In PSHE we will be covering relationships. We will be thinking about-

Reading

Monster Phonic books will be sent home Friday and need to returned back the following Monday. This is because we use these books for guided reading. Children can keep their library book for as long as they wish as long as it is returned to school.

Guided reading in class is done weekly and their book is linked to their phonetic ability which will then be sent home on Fridays. Children are working very hard on their comprehension skills. Which is an extremely important element of reading being able to understand what has been read.

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Science

In Science, this term we will be learning all about animals including humans. We will be focusing on-

In Spring 2 we will move onto learning about plants.

Religious Education

In R.E.- We are focusing on 'Who made the world?' By the end of this unit we will be able to:

- Retell the story of creation from Genesis 1:1-2.3 simply.
- Recognise that 'Creation' is the beginning of the 'big story' of the Bible.
- Say what the story tells Christians about God, Creation and the world.
- Give at least one example of what Christians do to say thank you to God for the Creation.

Computing

Within computing, we are using— Spring 1 - Using the internet

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Geography

Our topic this term is 'My Local Area and Tulum, Mexico' we will be gaining a wide range of skills ranging from, map reading, being able to locate the 7 continents, 5 main oceans and so much more. We will be focusing on the following objectives:

- I can interpret information from different types of maps and am beginning to locate key features within Scotland, UK, Europe or the wider world.
- Having explored the ways journeys can be made, I can consider the advantages and disadvantages of different forms of transport, discussing their impact on the environment
- By comparing my local area with a contrasting area out with Britain, I can investigate the main features of weather and climate, discussing the impact on living things.
- By exploring a natural environment different from my own, I can discover how the physical features influence the variety of living things.





Physical Education

Monday- Indoor, so your child will require a P.E t-shirt, shorts and trainers/pumps. We will be focusing on gymnastics.

Thursday-Outdoor, so your child will require a P.E t-shirt, tracksuit bottoms and trainers (school/blue hoodie can also be used)- We will be focusing on target games.

We will also be completing the daily mile each day.







Art & DT

For Spring 1 the children are designing and building a ferris wheel. They will learn about axles, frames, wheels and pods and how to create a stable structure that moves.

In Spring 2 the unit it called 'Map it Out'. We will be exploring different ways of creating artistic maps including 3D, stained 'glass' and block printing.

We will also complete some cooking sessions with Mrs Roberts and Mrs Harrison building upon the skills we have previously been taught.

Music

In music this half term we will be exploring music through feelings. We will focus on some key inspirational artists and sing along to age appropriate songs. We will also have the opportunity to play our school instruments.

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
